Our Education Studies programs are accredited by Northcentral Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Wisconsin Department Public Instruction.


The Secondary **Education major** prepares students to teach in the following areas:

Program admission requirements

Admission to the UW-Eau Claire Teacher Education MCEA (Secondary) program requires passing the Praxis I test of math, reading and writing, or have the required ACT/SAT/GRE scores as well as demonstrating success in the university's pre-program course (ES212). Admission the pre-program

requires achieving a 2.75 minimum grade point average and earning a grade of C or higher in Blugold Seminar in Critical Reading & Writing. Additionally, content departments have requirements for admission which focus predominantly on content knowledge. Students are

admitted on a selective and limited basis from a pool of candidates who meet minimum criteria.
